

## Outdoor Imperial Rounds (Rounds Measured in Yards)



**Target Face Size:** 122cm for all rounds and at all distances of each round (the longest distance is shot first, then the next longest, and so on)

**Scoring:** 5-Zone Scoring 9 7 5 3 1

**Sighters:** One end (six arrows) of sighters at the longest distance only; no sighters will be permitted at the remaining distances

**No. of Arrows:** Indicated in the table below, as the number of arrows to be shot at each distance (in dozens). Competitions may use timed ends, in which archers have 4 mins to shoot 6 arrows, or a '3 and 3' system, where archers have 2½ mins to shoot 3 arrows and then leave the shooting line to allow another archer on their target to shoot. When that archer has finished, the first archer has another 2½ mins to shoot their remaining 3 arrows.

\*\*An indication is given of the age and sex of archers who would generally shoot each round in a competition (where applicable; some rounds such as the American would be shot by all archers). Archers may however request to shoot other rounds with an equivalent number of arrows (e.g. a Hereford instead of a York, or vice-versa) if there is space for them to do so; they may not be eligible for a medal but they would still be eligible for classifications and County Records! :) And of course you can shoot any round you wish at a club session :)
