

Indoor Scoring Rounds Explained:

Portsmouth Round:

The Portsmouth round consists of 5 dozen arrows shot in ends of 3 arrows on a 60cm target face at 20 yards. You are allowed two ends of sighters (6 arrows in total) before commencing to score the round. The Portsmouth round uses 10 zone scoring from 1 to 10. For all rounds a miss is always marked with an M.

60cm Target Face:



For Portsmouth badges and Indoor Classification Awards: Score sheets must be fully completed and signed by the archer shooting the round. The scoring must also be witnessed and the score sheet signed off by another archer.

Bray I Round:

The Bray I round consists of 2 ½ dozen arrows shot in ends of 3 arrows on a 40cm target face at 20 yards. You are allowed two ends of sighters (6 arrows in total) before commencing to score the round. The Bray I round uses 10 zone scoring from 1 to 10.

40cm Target Face:



For Indoor Classification Awards: Score sheets must be fully completed and signed by the archer shooting the round. The scoring must also be witnessed and the score sheet signed off by another archer.

Worcester Round:

The Worcester round consists of 60 arrows shot in ends of 5 arrows on a special 16" target face at 20 yards. You are allowed one end of sighters (5 arrows in total) before commencing to score the round. The Worcester round uses 5 zone scoring from 1 to 5.

60cm Target Face:



For Indoor Classification Awards: Score sheets must be fully completed and signed by the archer shooting the round. The scoring must also be witnessed and the score sheet signed off by another archer.

WA 18m Round (Full Face):

The WA 18m round consists of 60 arrows shot in ends of 3 arrows on a 40cm target face at 18 meters. You are allowed up to 45 minutes practise before commencing to score the round. The WA 18m round uses 10 zone scoring from 1 to 10.

40cm Target Face:



For Indoor Classification Awards: Score sheets must be fully completed and signed by the archer shooting the round. The scoring must also be witnessed and the score sheet signed off by another archer.

WA 18m Round (Vertical 3 Spot):

The Vertical WA 18m round consists of 60 arrows shot in ends of 3 arrows on a special vertical 3 spot target face at 18 meters. You are allowed up to 45 minutes practise before commencing to score the round. The vertical WA 18m round uses 5 zone scoring from 6 to 10 and you must shoot one arrow at each target face. Any arrows shot out of the 6 ring are marked as a miss.

Vertical 3 Spot Target Face:

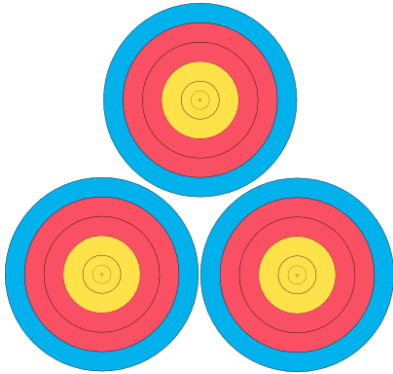


For Indoor Classification Awards: Score sheets must be fully completed and signed by the archer shooting the round. The scoring must also be witnessed and the score sheet signed off by another archer.

Vegas 18m Round (Triangle 3 Spot):

The Vegas 18m round consists of 60 arrows shot in ends of 3 arrows on a special triangle 3 spot target face at 18 meters. You are allowed up to 45 minutes practise before commencing to score the round. The Vega 18m round uses 5 zone scoring from 6 to 10 and you must shoot one arrow at each target face. Any arrows shot out of the 6 ring are marked as a miss.

Triangle 3 Spot Target Face:



For Indoor Classification Awards: Score sheets must be fully completed and signed by the archer shooting the round. The scoring must also be witnessed and the score sheet signed off by another archer.
