
In a World Archery round (those beginning 'WA' in the table), after scoring but before pulling the arrows, archers need to mark each of the holes in the target face with a short pen mark to help identify where arrows later bounce out or pass through the target.

Sighters: For World Archery rounds, a <u>maximum</u> of 45 minutes of practice will be given, in timed 4-minute ends during which you can shoot as many arrows as you like. For the other rounds listed there will be one end (six arrows) of sighters. For all rounds, sighters/practice will be at the longest distance only; no sighters/practice will be permitted at the remaining distances.

**No. of Arrows:** Indicated in the table below, as the number of arrows to be shot at each distance (in dozens). Timed ends are usually used in competitions, so archers have 4 mins to shoot 6 arrows or 2 mins to shoot 3 arrows.

Competitions are often advertised by the names of the senior rounds (which are sometimes even shortened, e.g. '1440 Rounds'). At these competitions a junior would usually shoot the ageappropriate equivalent round, as indicated by the highlights in the table, but please check with the organisers if it is not clear from the entry form whether junior rounds are available.

WA 720 rounds may be used to seed for Head to Head matches. The 50m round is for compounds and is normally shot on a target face with scoring rings for scores of 6 and greater, with one target face per archer.

Archers may however request to shoot other rounds with an equivalent number of arrows (e.g. a Hereford instead of a York, or vice-versa) if there is space for them to do so; they may not be eligible for a medal but they would still be eligible for classifications and County Records!:) And of course you can shoot any round you wish at a club session:)
